Founded in 1784, Moses Brown School has been a leader in education for over 235 years. Our stunning 33-acre campus—formerly the farm of 18th-century Quaker abolitionist leader Moses Brown—provides expansive academic, artistic, and athletic facilities right in the heart of Providence.

We are a Quaker school, one of the oldest and largest of a network of 80 Friends schools in the U.S. While each is independent, we all share the same essential mission: to nurture and celebrate each child's special gifts, talents, and identities—what Quakers refer to as their Inner Light. Rooted in the Quaker values of simplicity and integrity, community and equality, care and peace, we apply these values every day to create an academic culture of deep reflection, expansive curiosity, and spirited inquiry.

At Moses Brown School, 100 faculty members serve nearly 800 students ages 3-18, with a student-to-teacher ratio of 8:1. Our lower and middle school programs offer a rigorous and balanced approach to academics, social-emotional learning, and student skills in a well-coordinated structure that promotes and enhances the learning process through close personal contact between students and teachers.

The student experience is incredibly varied, including 17 musical and performance groups across the school, 50 clubs and activities, and 63 athletic teams competing in 17 different sports. And while individual achievement is celebrated, learning at Moses Brown is a shared enterprise. We foster a close sense of community, evident in collaborative relationships between students and teachers and in our weekly meeting for worship.

Our diverse community is strong enough to hold hundreds of brilliant, unique, independent-minded people. With \$7 million awarded annually in need-based financial aid, Moses Brown partners with many families to make a shared investment in bright, caring, and thoughtful children from all socioeconomic backgrounds. And with 28% of our student body being people of color, our community reflects the demographics of our drawing area. We are seeking a **full-time woodshop teacher** to join our robust and integrated visual arts program. The teaching responsibilities include a K-4 woodshop curriculum and a middle school woodshop/making program. They will be able to support students where they are and differentiate between a wide range of proficiencies. This position is responsible for the safety procedures, supply, maintenance, and management of the woodshop. In addition to the core teaching responsibilities, Moses Brown teachers are expected to serve on committees, attend school meetings, and have yearly co-curricular responsibilities.

A desire to work in a team-based collaborative environment is essential. This position offers an opportunity to collaborate with lower and middle school students, faculty, and parents. The

candidate will create curricular units to instill a love for creativity, exploration, and excitement for the arts.

Applicants must have a bachelor's degree from a four-year accredited institution. Elementary or middle school teaching experience is preferred, although not a requirement for application. A Master's degree or a teaching credential is desirable.

The position is effective August 2023. Compensation is competitive, and the school offers excellent benefits.
